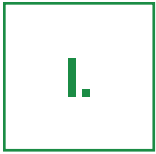

The paper used in this CSR Report is certified by Programme for the Endorsement of Forest Certification (PEFC) signifying that the forest-based materials used in the paper came from sustainably-managed forests. Our printer, Primex Printers, Inc., also utilizes Kodak Sonora process-free plates, soy-based ink, and a Heidelberg carbon neutral offset press resulting in lesser chemical wastes and air contaminants during the printing process.

These show how PERC gives high importance to environmental preservation and to its sustainability journey.





MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

No doubt that COVID-19 pandemic has hit many businesses, operationally and financially. But it also enabled companies to go beyond their usual routine and to innovate, to survive and thrive. Our Company, was no exemption. Although our power business was not vastly affected, we had to devise ways to mitigate impact and help our employees and host communities.

As our immediate response, we had to ensure that our employees are safe and their jobs secured. We arranged for work-from-home schemes and implemented additional health protocols in the workplace. We conduct regular testing and monitoring, and before end of 2021, we aim to vaccinate all our employees and their registered dependents.

For our Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) projects in 2020, we focused on promoting nutrition, assisting students in remote learning, and providing help to our first responders. We provided vitamins and health supplements to children in host communities in Tarlac, Batangas, and Aklan to help strengthen their immunity. Free consultation and medicines are continuously given at Sitio Capuz Health Center in Batangas to address the basic medical needs of residents and nearby communities.

It is also timely that we were able to remit P1.7MM of ER 1-94 (Benefit to Host Communities) fund to Barangay San Rafael and City of Sto. Tomas in Batangas, through Maibarara Geothermal Inc. (MGI). The funds will be used to construct an isolation facility to address the COVID-19 situation in the area.

When the Department of Education (DepEd) shifted to online or remote classes, our Companies responded by donating mobile phones and tablets to Puting Lupa Elementary School in Batangas and to Batasan Elementary School in Cotabato. The gadgets are used to monitor the learning progress of the students and to aid them in their academic journey in the new normal. We also awarded new scholarship grants to four (4) deserving students from Aklan and three (3) from Batangas.

In order to help our first responders, we donated food and protective equipment. We turned-over KN95 masks and food packs to the frontliners of Philippine General Hospital (PGC). Similarly, food items were donated to the Barangay officials and frontliners in Tarlac, Batangas, and Aklan.

Despite the challenges brought by the pandemic, we are pleased to share that our environmental and CSR efforts were once again recognized by award-giving entities. PetroWind Energy Inc. (PWEI) was awarded with the 2020 Asia Corporate Excellence and Sustainability Awards by the MORS Group while PetroSolar Corporation (PSC) entered the Hall of Fame of PEZA Awards for Outstanding Community Projects.

We may be in a long haul recovery but we are certain that we are in this together. Rest assured that our Companies will continue to provide aid to our employees and host communities in the best and safest ways we can.

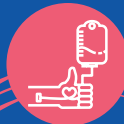

II.

COVID-19 RESPONSE

PetroEnergy Resources Corporation (PERC) and subsidiaries – PetroGreen Energy Corporation (PGEC), Maibarara Geothermal Inc. (MGI), PetroWindEnergy Inc. (PWEI), and PetroSolar Coproation (PSC) donated 1000 pcs of KN95 masks and 500 food packs to the frontliners of Philippine General Hospital (PGH) last September 1, 2020. All in all, Petro subsidiaries were able to distribute in three (3) tranches from March of 2020 up until May of 2021.





On June 7, 2021, PWEI formally turnover one (1) unit of ambulance to the Province of Aklan through its Provincial Government. The ambulance was received by Governor Florencio Miraflores and Provincial Administration Atty. Selwyn Ibarreta.

Governor Miraflores expressed his gratitude to PWEI for the said donation, which will help the Province in its COVID-19 response.



Last April 1, 2020, PWEI donated food packs to frontliners of its host communities - Barangays Gibon, Unidos, Pawa and Rizal in Nabas and Brgy. Napaan in Malay. This was followed by a donation of 118 sacks of rice to indigent families in the said communities last April 29 to 30, 2020. The respective barangay chairpersons and officials expressed gratitude and told PWEI that the donations will surely help those who lost their income due to quarantine.



In Batangas, three (3) donation drives were conducted. MGI donated a total of 200 pcs of rice and food supplies to the barangay officials and health workers (BHW) in support of their public service during this health crisis. Around 90 sacks of rice were donated to Barangays San Rafael and Puting Lupa in Sto. Tomas and Makiling in Calamba City. Before end-2020, MGI also donated food packs to the the 4Ps beneficiaries of Sitio Capuz, Barangays Santiago, San Antonio and Puting Lupa.

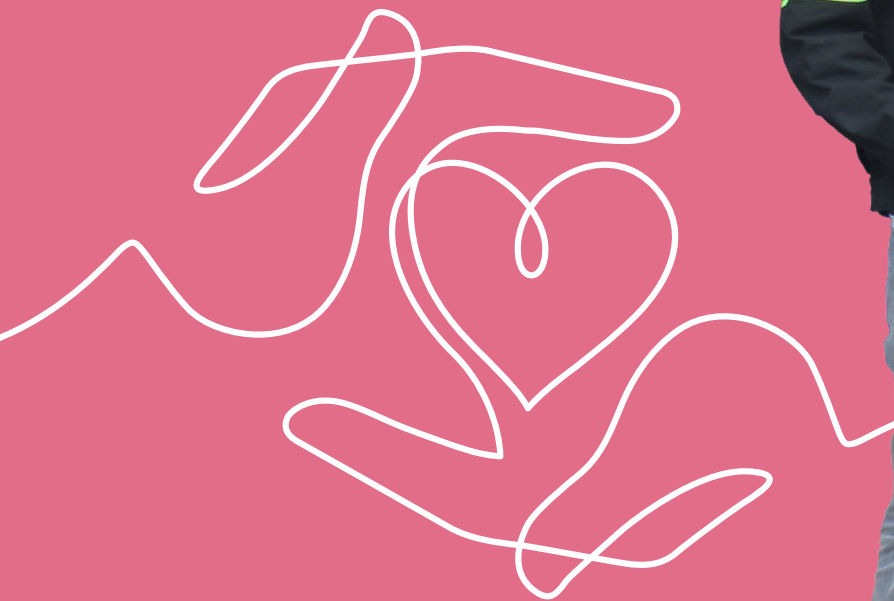


PSC donated 80 sacks of rice to Brgy. Balete and Brgy. Lourdes in Tarlac City last May 2, 2020. This is in addition to the food packs provided to the frontliners of 11 Barangays of Hacienda Luisita also in Tarlac. The 3rd tranche of donation in Tarlac happened last May 2021 with 155 household recipients coming from the poorest of the poor.



HEALTH

Our HEALTH projects aim in ensuring that residents of our host communities have access to basic medical services and proper nutrition.





As part of its health program, PWEI turned over one-year supply of vitamins for six (6) malnourished children from Brgy. Napaan last May 18, 2020 and nine (9) children from Brgy. Pawa last June 22, 2020.

NUTRITION PROMOTION



In Batangas, MGI also provided 3-month supply of vitamins to children and senior citizens of Sitio Capuz, San Rafael, San Antonio, and Barangay Puting Lupa, Sto. Tomas, Batangas.

MGI also ensures that there are continuous supply of medicines in its Health Center in Sitio Capuz. Medicines for common ailments like cough, fever, flu and pain can be availed by the residents of nearby communities, for free. The distribution is managed and monitored by a Barangay Health Workers (BHW). Consultation prior to prescription of medicines is also being undertaken in the health center.



In Tarlac, PSC continuously implements its 3-year project against malnutrition called PetroBibo Project. The Project aims to help 37 pupils of Parang Elementary School combat malnutrition through proper preparation of healthy foods, regular check-up and monitoring, as well as provision of vitamins and health supplements. From the original 37 pupils categorized as "severely wasted", there have been a significant improvement to five (5) pupils belonging in the said category as of May 2021.

EDUCATION

Our EDUCATION projects cover three objectives: engage the community through information, educate them through formal programs, and enable them by providing proper learning materials and facilities.

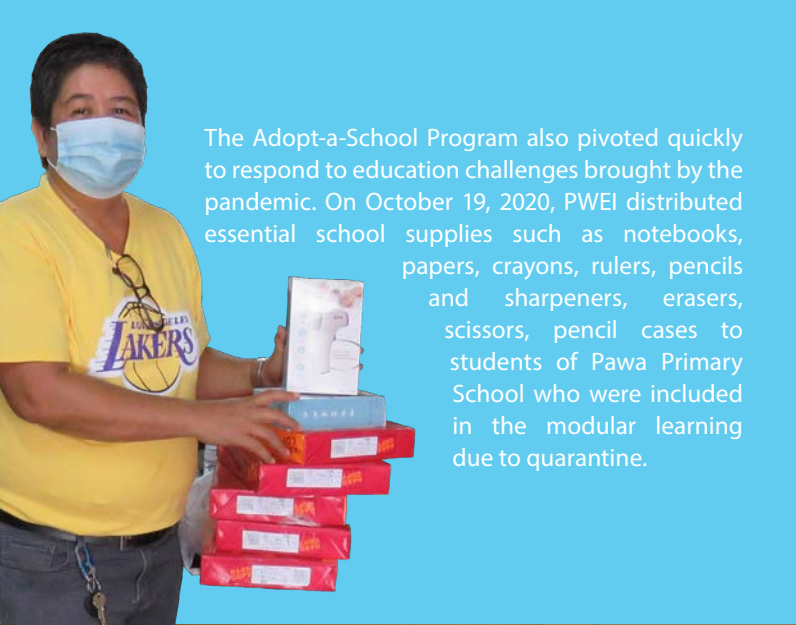




ADOPT-A-SCHOOL PROJECT



On September 30, 2020, PWEI also turned-over the refurbished Molada Daycare Center to the Brgy. Captain and School Teacher of Brgy. Rizal, Nabas, Aklan. Now the center is ecologically conscious, resilient, clean, and conducive to learning, and students to benefit with complete light, tables and chairs, and toilet.



The Adopt-a-School Program also pivoted quickly to respond to education challenges brought by the pandemic. On October 19, 2020, PWEI distributed essential school supplies such as notebooks, papers, crayons, rulers, pencils and sharpeners, erasers, scissors, pencil cases to students of Pawa Primary School who were included in the modular learning due to quarantine.



Opening of classes in Batangas was also affected by COVID-19 Pandemic. Shifting of face-to-face classes into distance learning using technological advances was preferred by the government to protect the students from the disease. However, in this approach of learning, the poor families are mostly affected. To help the indigent families of Puting Lupa Elementary School, MGI donated fifty (50) units of "talk and text" cellphones in support to "modular distance learning" approach of teaching. In this approach, the teachers will take the responsibility of monitoring the progress of the students while the students will ask the assistance of the teachers through text message. The cellphone serves as a useful device to monitor the performance of the students particularly those needing remediation or assistance.

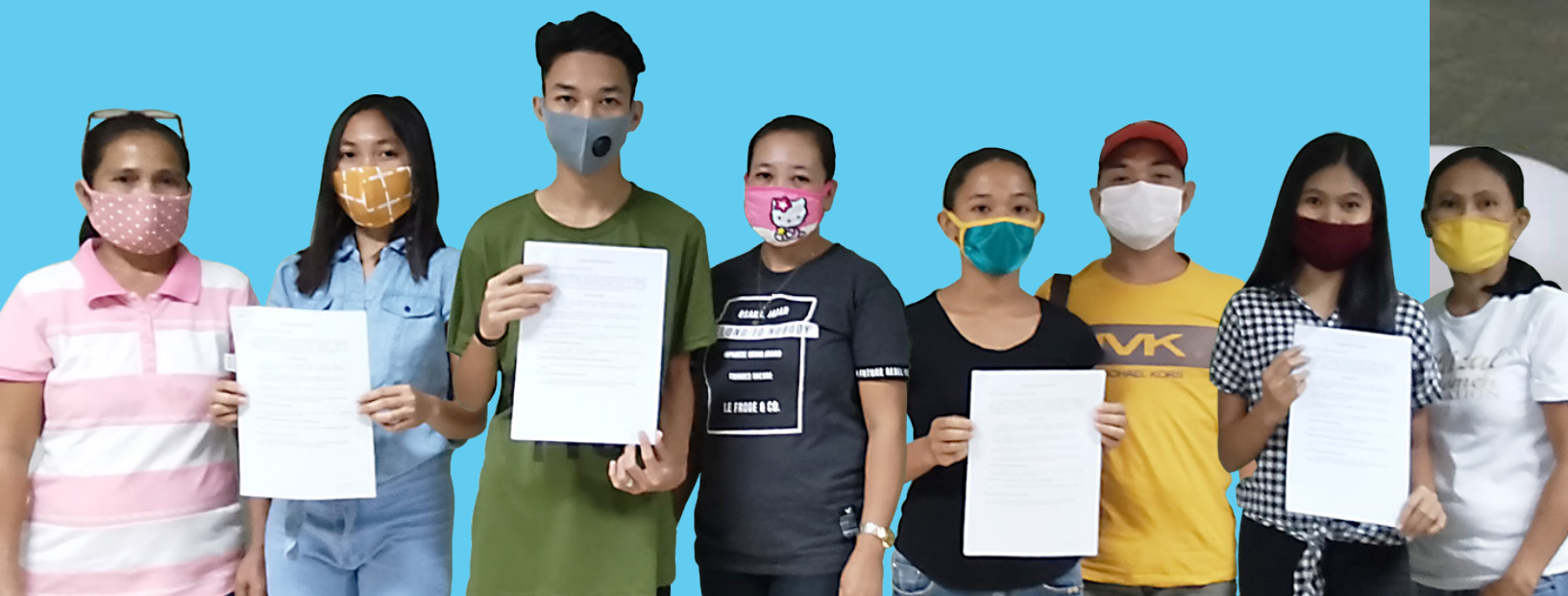
On November 4, 2020, PSC turned over two (2) units of heavy duty printing machines, ten (10) toner inks, and 50 reams of bond paper to







PWEI continues its commitment to provide equitable quality education to its communities. This year, PWEI welcomes four (4) additional scholars (Batch 5): Two recipients from Brgy. Nabaoy and Brgy. Pawa is now taking up 2 years Culinary Hotel and Restaurant Entrepreneurship at Verde Grande College Inc. in Kalibo, Aklan; and two recipients from Brgy. Rizal and Brgy. Tagororoc will be taking up a 4-year course in Aklan State University. The signing of the Agreement took place last August 3, 2020.



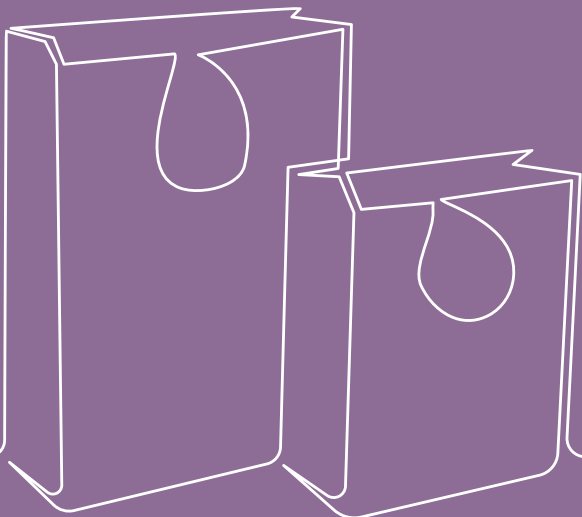

LIVELIHOOD

PWEI hosted the first Nabas Bariw Bag Design and Painting Contest. The activity aims to showcase the creativity and ingenuity of Nabasnons while promoting renewable energy, indigenous livelihood, and ecotourism. The bags were produced by the Pawa Agri-Ecotourism and Livelihood Development Association (PAELDA) and were painted by participating artists. Winners were awarded last December 16, 2020 in PWEI Logistics Office in Brgy. Gibon.







ER 1-94: COMMUNITY BENEFITS FROM RENEWABLE ENERGY

ER 1-94, also known as Financial Benefits to Host Communities is one of government's mechanisms to ensure that host governments and communities benefit from renewable energy projects. The policy requires that one centavo per kilowatt-hour (P0.01/kWh) of the electricity sales be shared with host governments and communities for their development projects.

In October and November 2020, MGI provided the ER 1-94 shares of the City of Sto. Tomas and Barangay San Rafael respectively. The shares amounting to P1.7M for Sto. Tomas City and P1.2M for Barangay San Rafael will finance construction of isolation facilities and other related health services as part of their COVID-19 response.

PSC Green House Project



The PSC Greenhouse project aims to showcase that renewable energy can sustainably co-exist with plants and animals. The greenhouse was designed and installed with technical assistance from Harbest Corporation. At present, organic vegetables such as cucumber, cabbage, okra, tomatoes, lettuce are being grown in the greenhouse.

PWEI Turned-Over 12 Pcs Of Color-Coded Waste Bins And 2 Units Of Pedicabs For Garbage Collection

On October 01, 2020, PWEI formally turned-over 12 pcs of color-coded waste bins and 2 units of pedicabs for garbage collection, to Brgy. Gibon, Nabas. The waste collection materials are intended for Ecological Solid Waste Management compliance of the barangay. Present during the ceremonial turnover were Nabas Municipal Vice Mayor Wilfredo Cezar, Brgy. Gibon Chairman Zenaida Cezar, and the barangay council and some residents. The project aims to promote environmental protection through proper waste management in its host community.

PWEI celebrates Environmental Month

PWEI celebrated its Environment Month in 2020 by spearheading a “Plant and Post” Backyard Vegetable Planting and Online Photo Contest. For the whole month of June, select Nabas residents planted vegetables in their backyard and posted it on social media. The celebration was participated by residents of Brgy. Gibon, Unidos, Rizal, and Napaan, and the winners were announced on social media last July 14, 2020. The goal of this activity is to help PWEI host communities to plant for self-sufficiency so that they have fresh vegetables to serve on their tables and lessen their food expenses during the lockdown/quarantine period.

A tree planting of two hundred (200) seedlings of pine trees within barangay roadsides going to PWEI power plant were also conducted as a culminating activity.



MGI initiates Backyard Planting and Online Photo Contest

In Batangas, MGI celebrated the month through “Backyard Planting and Online Photo Contest”. Residents of Sitio Capuz , Brgy. Puting Lupa and all employees of MGI were invited to join the contest by planting trees and vegetables in their backyards and post the photos in the social media. The contest has positive impact in the community wherein some who joined the contest continue what they have started and now they are selling the harvest from their backyards.





MGI also spearheaded a tree-planting and community clean up drive.
